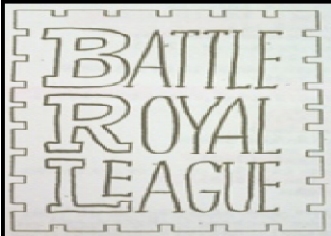

THE BRL: THEN AND NOW

400 cycles! 26 years. The BRL is older than some of the managers who play here. I joined the IWA in 1987 in the CCL (Clawing Cat League) with The Hawaiian and then quickly joined the IWA's three oldest leagues, the All-Star League, Grand Masters League and BRL. All three had great characters, feuds and fantastic trash talk, but I went to the GML with Superstar Rick Riley and quickly had the league chasing him after he piledrove the top babyface team's valet through a table. If not for the departure of nearly all of the GML's top managers, we may be reading my 400th cycle for the GML since the IWA closed the GML, so I sent Rick to the BRL. When the Murder Foundation stable tried to control the league in the way AE just tried, I rallied the games best managers to come to the BRL. The early and mid-1990's saw some of the games best compete in the BRL and I had the honor of being the Commissioner through many of those years. You will see my year by year recap of the years I was here later in this report to give you a better understanding of the rich history of the BRL. This league has been a labor of love for me and I will admit that there have been some breaks in between but just like an old flame, you can reunite and pick up right where you left off. This time, I committed to bringing the best effort to the BRL and that meant some changes to the format of the league. American division status was a step towards giving the BRL a shot at IWA Report and three times we have taken that championship. The three strikes rule was our first step towards keeping the playing field level in the BRL as we made it simple, either you compete in the BRL or you are out. Then we added the six wrestler limit to not only keep flooders out, but to make managers bring the wrestlers they care about to the BRL. I want to thank all of you who have played in the BRL and helped to make the BRL the IWA's greatest league. If you doubt that statement, I invite you to read this report, recognize the history and all of the greats who have helped make this league stand out. I want to thank Frank Snow, who kept the BRL going through some of the light years and has helped temper my random ideas with concrete advice to keep the league stronger than ever before. I have known Frank for over 20 years and a fun factoid, he refereed my very first pro wrestling match that was held in Lawrenceville, GA under the Southland Championship Wrestling promotion run by former IWA Manager of the Year and Mr. Wrestling World, Scott Franklin. Just be sure to watch both parts of the match to see the exciting conclusion to the match! I have some stills from the match below. Finally, I want to thank the IWA for supporting the BRL and the many different initiatives Frank and I have come up with over the years. The Frank Marano Memorial Tag Team Tournament turned 20 this year and the popular Tag Team Derby began here in 1995. The Global Impact title has had many names over the years, but it is the Commissioner's championship and any one can compete for it, to earn a FREE TV title shot (regardless of ranking) and FREE entry into the Battle Royal!

THE BRL'S 400TH CYCLE CELEBRATION – BATTLECADE 2011: 400 CYCLES OF GREATNESS (PART 1)

(The screen opens up with 1985 and the BRL's first arena, the Battledome. The years begin ticking upwards as the various stars are shown through the years as each year passes until finally 2011 zooms towards the screen. 'The arena thunders with fireworks as the fans stand, applaud and cheer wildly.)

JB: Fans, welcome to Battlecade 2011 here inside the newly renovated Battledome in front of 20,000 rabid fans who can't wait to see this 400th celebration. My name is Jim Bossy and it has been my honor to call the action here in the BRL and next to me is the son of a legend, Dick Jackson Jr.

DJJ: They did a nice job with this place. Did you know they have flat screen TV's on the back of the bathroom stall doors? Now that's attention to detail.

JB: Junior! Our first match pits a long time veteran, **John the Mask Smith** as he takes on an outspoken newcomer, **Evan Adrenaline** who wasted no time announcing his intent to take titles and take out the rookie sensation, **Hot Stuff Adam Ca\$h**. If those two get in the ring, it will be fireworks.

DJJ: Right now we have to opposite of fireworks, Smith still shaking hands with the fans. I think we should rename him John the Yawn Smith.

JB: Evan is pacing and jogs across the ring, goes into a run and dives over the top rope and crashed down onto Smith. Oh my, a few fans were knocked over as well. Evan grabs a fans soda and throws it in the eyes of Smith who stumbles back into the apron. Adrenaline fires off a series of kicks and then a jab to the nose. Evan rolls Smith into the ring and stops to wink into the camera before climbing into the ring. Smith regains his senses and hammers away at Evan with thunderous forearms that rattle the youngster. The fans are rallying behind John, with chants of 'here we go John, here we go!' These fans are something.

DJJ: Oh sure, they sent me all those letters and cards while I was in the hospital... oh wait... they didn't send me anything, but they cheer the Yawn.

JB: Don't choke on those sour grapes Junior. Smith is going for his finisher, the Overhead Toss, but Evan grabs the top rope to spin out. Smith throws Evan into the ropes and readies a clothesline, but Evan ducks and then hits the Game Changer! Ref **Willy Pinnem** counts 1... 2... 3! Adrenaline wins a big one here. Now he is calling for a microphone. What can he have to say now? (Evan wipes the sweat from his face, slicks his hair back and puts on his sunglasses.)

EA: The opening match? Really BRL? I should be in the main event, but I guess unless you happen to be the sons of a BRL legend, you don't get the breaks they do. Mark my words, at Battlecade 2012, I will be a main eventer! Now I have a surprise in store for you all. Tonight I will start something, no one will forget.

JB: Evan drops the mic and walks away to boos, but what can he mean by that? That 'surprise' sounds very ominous, indeed.

DJJ: I don't know too much about him, but I know a lot more about this next match. Another match up of new versus old. Kind of like is Jim.

JB: We make a fine team. This six-man match features one of the greatest six-man teams in BRL history, **The Rages, Cuthrak, Rasmuth and Ollis** as they face the unusual team of **Marbas Vader, Barbatos Fett** and the former BRL heavyweight champion, the huge **Bael the Hutt**.

DJJ: I don't want to say Bael the Hutt is fat... but is he gets much bigger they'll have to re-classify him as a one-man tag team.

JB: Ha ha. Bael is going to start the match with the 2010 BRL Wrestler of the Year, Cuthrak Rage who gets a warm reception from the fans. It still amazes me that he doesn't have a bigger following. He has the ring skills, takes care of himself physically, but in many ways he reminds me of the BRL legend **Hades**.

DJJ: No, your thinking of Hades pals, **Cerberus**, they never spoke. Hades didn't speak often, but when he did, you remembered. Hutt wants a test of strength?

JB: Cuthrak looks over to his brothers and shrugs before accepting and they lock fingers and this test of strength is on. Bael uses his, uhm his advantage of-

DJJ: Fat advantage? He is massive and Cuthrak grimaces as he works his way to one knee and throws a shoulder into the Hutt's gut. Hey, that rhymed!

JB: I'm glad you brought you're a-game tonight. Cuthrak tags in Rasmuth who kicks Bael who stumbles back and Barbatos tags in, circling before they lock up.

DJJ: I think its great we have so many international stars here now. I spent a week in Barbatos, got a really great tan and met this girl Miosotis with the biggest-
JB: Junior! Fett and Rasmuth collide with clotheslines, both men are down and crawling for a tag. Ollis and Marbas tag in and both come in on fire, exchanging punches and forearms. Ollis is back into the ropes and Cuthrak makes a blind tag, Vader reads to clobber Ollis who holds onto the top rope and points. Marbas turns and is leveled by RAGE! My goodness, 1... 2... NO, broken up by Barbatos who is tackled to the floor by Ollis. Bael slowly makes his way into the ring and catches Rasmuth in a massive avalanche into the corner, ouch! Rasmuth crumples and Bael roars at the fans, but turns around and Cuthrak hits another RAGE that sends Bael over the top rope! Look out in the front row as the Hutt crashes into ringside. Cuthrak and Rasmuth the hit a double RAGE on Marbas for the 1... 2... 3! The Rage brothers win in a close one. I guess you could say the battle of young and old stands and 1-1-1, right Junior?

DJJ: You made us a draw, didn't you? Sigh. Can I talk about Miosotis again? Listen, when I say huge, it doesn't begin to describe the size of her-

JB: Lets move on to our next match a **Tag Team Bunkhouse Battle Royal** where they can wear what they want to the ring and the winning team gets to take on the **Global Impact Champion** in a **Handicap** match on the next **Saturday Night Impact** show. This is a diverse mix of teams; **Partyman & Sacramento Stud, Sugar Daddy Pimp & Bob Octane, Lumberjack Paul D. Boot & Dark Phoenix FS, Coach Klein & Bobby Boucher, Greg Focker & Bernie Focker, Satanic Stormtroopers 1 & 2, Hooded Puritans 1 & 2, Back of the Neck & Clenched Fist, The Detonators TNT & Dynamite** and a mystery tag team we still haven't seen yet. The ring attire varies from jeans, cowboy boots, three piece suits, running suits, football pads and the Stormtroopers are in riot gear.

DJJ: Did this should just turn into some perverse fashion show for the people who survive the Zombie apocalypse? Huge Jim, they were HUGE! Basketballs!

JB: Enough! The bell rings and many of the competitors gang up on the 'huge' Bob Octane, happy now Junior? Octane isn't budging and manages to toss out Hooded Puritan #2 for our first elimination! We are still short one team, as Coach Klein and Bernie Focker both spill over the top rope to the floor.

DJJ: Thereby taking out both awful comedy-themed tag teams. What a relief.

JB: The Satanic Stormtroopers make a real effort to single out the Partyman and dump him over the top rope. The Party... is over for the Partyman & Stud.

DJJ: That was a bad pun. I almost expected a (southern drawl imitation of Bossy) 'those Stormtroopers don't like to party', but no, you went the extra mile.

JB: I do what I can, Junior, but right now there is nothing Back of the Neck can do as the Sugar Daddy Pimp throws him out of the ring.

DJJ: When it comes to gimmicks, sure I poke fun at the Fockers of the world, but I don't know where to start with Clenched First and Back of the Neck?

JB: That's because you don't understand the underground hip hop movement and the roughneck lifestyle.

DJJ: Oh so it's not a reference to the Khia song, 'My neck, My Back (Lick it)'? Which reminds me, this Miosotis really liked when I would-

JB: Good lord, there are children watching! As the high flying Detonators use a double dropkick to eliminate Dark Phoenix. Got something to say about him?

DJJ: Sure. The 2009 Wrestler of the Year is an underrated star who helped send the **Baddest American Bikers** packing. What? I have nice things to say too.

JB: Sigh. The Stormtroopers and Detonators are trying to dump out Octane again, and wait a minute, I don't recognize the music that just came on? Charging out of the back carrying a ladder and a steel chair are the electrifying **Donovan brothers, Tyson and Tyler!** These two are high flying daredevils who just signed with the BRL and they have stormed the ring. Tyson slams the chair over the head of Satanic Stormtrooper #1 and Tyler rams the ladder into Pimp.

Tyson goes to smash Octane with the chair next, but Big Bob grabs it mid-swing and laughs. The Donovans and the Detonators team up for a quadropole dropkick that drives the chair into Octane's face! Bob teeters and then falls backwards over the top rope and crashes to the floor! The fans stand and cheer as the favorite to win this has just been eliminated. Now it is just down to the Donovans, the Detonators and the Satanic Stormtroopers! Dynamite and TnT go after Stormtrooper #2 and work at getting him over the top rope, while the Donovans set up the ladder and try to pick up Stormtrooper #1, he clocks Tyson with his riot helmet and chokes Tyler on the top rope. Tyler is teetering and at the same time, Stormtrooper #2 is going over, both men hit the floor and that means that the Bunkhouse Battle Royal has been won by the masked duo from Mexico, **TnT and Dynamite, the Detonators!** They will get a shot at the Global Impact Champion but now the question is... who will be the champion by then? When we come back we have a special six-man challenge match between **Powerteam USA: Stevens Ca\$h and Fatty** as the take on **Tommy Landell, Teddy Angel and Robert Van Damage** with guest ref, BRL legend, Badd Co.'s **Rick Riley!**

THE BRL'S 400TH CYCLE CELEBRATION – BATTLECADE 2011: 400 CYCLES OF GREATNESS (PART 2)

JB: This special challenge match up pits a lot of popular guys against each other so the fans will be split. Barry U-S-A Stevens leads Fatty the Butcher and Adam Ca\$h to the ring where Rick Riley has just finished checking Landell, Angel and RVD's boots for foreign objects.

DJJ: If he checks Fatty we may be here all night. I have to say after the retirement matches against Moore, I'm surprised to see Rick back.

JB: The fans hoped he would wrestle, but he is under contract with the ASL, but **Rick Riley** told backstage, he and **Victor Von Snapp** just signed on with another promotion, but wouldn't say which league they are going to next only that is isn't a return to the BRL. Hmm. Barry is going to start the match with RVD who has had a memorable rivalry with Fatty the Butcher. They exchange headlocks, and hammerlocks, each man showing their technical skills but RVD's swift kick to the gut knocks the wind out of Stevens and tags in Landell. Landell lays a series of chops into Barry's chest and then cold-cocks him with a forearm shiver. Barry is down, but wait, there is a man in an orange jumpsuit and black mask jumping over the railing and he attacks Fatty. My lord that is the madman born in a prison, **7709135!** He and Fatty are brawling right by us and spill into the stands! Fans are scrambling out of their way as the two big men exchange punches and smash each other with anything they can get a hold of. They have battled into the arena and out of our cameras so we will try to update you on that. In the ring, Barry is now being double teamed by Teddy and Tommy who are in control here. Rick Riley has called a fair match, but Barry needs a tag soon as he is in trouble here. Hold on, what now? Someone just ran in and yanked the feet out from under Adam Ca\$h and sent him to the floor! Jogging away and taunting Ca\$h is **Evan Adrenaline?** I know he is jealous of the attention the rookie has garnered, but this isn't the place to settle it. Ca\$h leaps up and chases after Evan which leaves Barry U-S-A Stevens alone against three men!! Barry reverses an Irish whip and floors Angel with a bulldog, but when he gets to the corner, there is no one to tag in. Stevens is looking around, confused and I think he just realized he is alone in this match. Landell tags in and hammers Barry in the back with a flying knee lift, goes for the cover and ref Rick counts: 1... 2... no! Barry kicks out. There is some fight left in him yet. We can only hope that Adam and Fatty can make it back to the ring in time. RVD tags in and comes off the ropes with a spin kick, but Barry ducks and turns it into a modified Powerbomb! Oh my! There is a thunderous USA-USA chant filling the arena as Barry uses a quick burst of energy to climb to the top rope and launches off for the USA-All-the-Way Splash, but Landell pulled RVD out of the way and Stevens lands on the mat face-first! Oh no. RVD, looks around and then leaps to the top rope, points this thumbs to his shoulders for the R-V-D and soars with a high Frog Splash that crushes Stevens. 1... 2... 3! An exciting win by Landell, Angel and RVD. I guess this challenge was answered. Rick Riley checks on Stevens who took a beating, but one has to wonder what happened to Fatty? Where did Adam go? What will happen to PowerteamUSA? Wait we are getting word from the back, so lets go there now with **Sue Plexxx**.

(Sue Plexxx is standing next to a huge BRL banner and adjusting her hair as Evan Adrenaline runs his hands through his hair and smiles.)

SP: Thanks Jim. Fatty and 7709135 have been detained by security in opposite sides of the building in an effort to stop their ruckus. I'm standing here with Evan Adrenaline who just helped PowerteamUSA lose their big match here at Battlecade by attacking Adam Ca\$h.

EA: Helped? Let me tell you something Sue, I told the fans I would deliver a surprise no one would forget and tonight I will as I announce that- (just then Adam Ca\$h storms in angrily, and stops short of fighting as Sue stands between them trying to hold Adam back.)

AC: What the hell? I've heard what you said about me, then you run out and pull me out of my PowerteamUSA match! I have one thing to say to you... (Adam brushes Sue aside and goes face-to-face with Evan, Sue cringes reading for the fight when they embrace in a hug and begin to laugh.)

AC: What took you so long? If I had to wrestle in another PowerteamUSA match or make another appearance at some lame fan event I'd jump off a bridge.

EA: I'm sorry bro, but I had to get that contract with the BRL hammered out.

SP: Wait a minute, what is going on here? Adam are you gonna quit PowerteamUSA? How could you walk out on Barry? That cost him the match.

EA: Allow me, Adam. Cost him the match? I think it's a pretty fair trade. Hot Stuff was on a tear in the BRL and well on his way to Wrestler of the Year, had his own interview segment and was the top ranked rookie but ever since he joined PowerteamUSA, hold on (makes a gagging gesture) he has been mired in mediocrity. I saw my longtime friend putting his own career on hold and for what? The Fans? I knew together he and I could rock the BRL. Right Adam?

SP: Now wait a minute. Adam, c'mon now. You have been a successful. The fans still talk about the Marano Tag Tourney finals, they were epic.

AC: Yeah an epic failure! We should have WON the Marano finals and if I had stuck to my style, we would have. Instead I had to hold back and look what it got me... second place. No more settling. We want to win and win now! Evan and I are going to team up and shake up the BRL as... Fast Ca\$h!

EA: PowerteamUSA was a mess and Adam was the only one with the guts to say it. PowerteamUSA is done.

(just then Barry U-S-A Stevens staggers in still hurting from the match. Wincing and holding his side he tries to speak, but has trouble talking through the pain. Evan looks at Adam as if to signal and attack, but Adam waves him off and shakes his head.)

AC: Look man, it was nothing personal. PowerteamUSA was killing my career. Sorry it had to be this way, but look at you. You can barely stand. Go see the medical staff and rethink what you are doing with your career. You get a pass this time, but don't try to stop or next time we won't be so generous.

(Evan pinches Sue's cheek as they turn and walk away. When Barry crumples to one knee. Sue goes to help him and begins shouting for a doctor)

JB: I'm stunned fans. I don't know what to say to what we just witnessed. PowerteamUSA is no more and Fast Ca\$h has arrived.

DJJ: Fast Ca\$h! FASSSSST CA\$h! It is just plain fun to say. Look Jim, it may not have been pretty, but the numbers don't lie. Adam's career nose-dived when he joined Barry. How could he not want out? I just hope that Adam can bounce back and make this Wrestler of the Year race close again.

JB: What about Barry? The man was clearly injured and who knows how badly? At least Fatty was battling a madman, but Adam just quit on his team. I am disgusted but I hope that Barry U-S-A Stevens will be okay. Next up we have the huge (looks at Junior who gestures 'out to here' with his hands and then shakes his head) match up as **The Legendary Frank Leatherman Snow** defends the **Global Impact** title against **Vercyntorix** AND the former champion and current leader in the Wrestler of the Year race... **Wulfgar!** The rookie was on quite a run and only recently had a couple of bad matches at bad times. First he lost the quarterfinal match with Cuthrak Rage a wrestler with a lot of experience and then faces one of the IWA's best veterans in Snow and loses there too.

DJJ: I bet you are the guy who sees a dude get hit by a car and then asks him if the bones sticking out through their skin hurts.

JB: At least you didn't reference super endowed women in your last line.

DJJ: Still plenty of show left. Looks like all three of these guys are ready. Wulfgar is pacing, Verc... Vercen... The V guy is ready and Snow cracks his neck.

JB: No doubt the veteran is weighing his options in this three way dance format. The bell rings and Wulfgar blindsides Vercyntorix with a running elbow smash that send him to the floor. Wulfgar circles the ring and slams his fist into his chest while taunting Snow. Snow unbuckled the Global Impact belt and tosses it at the rookie who brushes it aside, but that is all the opening the Leatherman needs to launch his assault. Wulfgar staggers back into the corner as Snow pours on the punches and tries to stun his foe, when a running knee lift from Vercyntorix smashes Snow into the corner as well. Verc whips Snow into the other tumbuckle and lines up Wulfgar for one as well, but the rookie, grabs the top rope, reverses it and elbows Verc in the side of the jaw. Wulfgar roars as he flexes at the fans and turns to see Snow, calling him on to face him. Wulfgar charges, but Snow side-steps and uses a single leg take down to gain control and he goes for an STF, but Vercyntorix breaks it up and drops an elbow across Wulfgar's back. Now he locks in an STF and he may have it, as Wulfgar looks ready to tap out, but Snow dropkicks Vercyntorix aside and then quickly tosses Wulfgar to the floor. Vercyntorix goes for a clothesline but Snow turns it into a Tilt-a-Whirl Suplex! Ref Pinnem makes the count: 1... 2... Wulfgar dives through the ropes, but can't stop the count of 3! Snow retains the Global Impact title! Wulfgar is outraged and toss over the ring steps. Snow points to the Global Impact belt and raises it up high.

THE BRL'S 400TH CYCLE CELEBRATION – BATTLECADE 2011: 400 CYCLES OF GREATNESS (PART 3... Yes 3!)

JB: I'm getting word that we have word from the back, that Sue Plexxx has caught up with 7709135 as he is being escorted out of the building. (Several security guards are ushering 7709135 out of the building when Sue Plexxx makes her way to the exit and asks for a moment.)

SP: Seven? Sevent! What's going on? Why are you being forced out of the building?

7709135: Seems like the BRL officials have a problem with the way I send a message to that tub of lard, Fatty the Butcher. He likes to use a fork to brutally win his matches, but I'm going to show him a new level of brutality. I've only agreed to take the rest of the night off since the powers that be agreed to my demand for a match that will allow me to show the BRL what a man can do with a fork when the rules are out the window, in our Fork on a Pole match at the next Saturday Night Impact! I'm going to carve you up like a Thanksgiving turkey and just in time for the Holidays! This Thanksgiving... I'm serving BLOOD! (7709135 shakes off the security team and laughs wildly as he leaves the BRL Battledome.)

SP: This night just gets weirder and stranger. What else can happen?

JB: Thank you Sue. It has indeed been a wild night and it looks to get wilder as our main event is next. A ten man Survivor Series style match pitting the team of **Maddog Dick Jackson, Mike White Lightning Moore, James Blanchard, Brad Blanchard** and stepping in for Frank Leatherman Snow will be the **Legendary Eddie Sweat** as they take on the team of **Bonecrusher, Arson Inc: Johnny Pyro, Michael Thorn, Francis Xavier Cross** and as yet unnamed mystery partner. This will begin with two men in the ring and a coin toss will determine which team will get the advantage for two minutes and then each team will send in a new member until both teams are full. At any time, a wrestler can be eliminated so this could get very one-sided and we can expect some hard justice tonight. Our first two competitors will be Dick Jackson and Arson Inc's big man, Francis Xavier Cross. DJ is urging the fans as they clap louder and louder, but Cross spits into the crowd and then charges into Jackson with a Shoulder block. DJ shakes off the move and blocks a big right hand to fire off a series of jabs and punches that ends with his twirling six-gun smash! Cross goes down and the fans erupt into thunderous cheers! I have to be honest and say that the deck really seems to be stacked against Cross and his teammates.

DJJ: Speaking of stacked- (DJJ looks over at Bossy who frowns) this Battlecade sure has been top heavy with talent.

JB: One team has three of the top wrestlers in BRL history while the others is a blend of men bent on destroying the Blanchards. DJ and Cross are locked up and Cross powers on a grinding headlock as the timer counts down. 3... 2... 1! Coin-Tosser, Daisy Chaynes. who flips the coin and it goes to Bonecrusher.

DJJ: I guess all his rowdy friends are here tonight... and they still think he sucks. Speaking of sucks-

JB: BRL Champion, Johnny Pyro enters the ring and hammers DJ with a double axe handle. Pyro stops to taunt the fans who responds with boos as Cross pulls DJ up and hits the Crucified to level DJ. Now Pyro lifts DJ and hits the Burn Notice. DJ is down and they won't cover him. DJ is in bad shape as they pick him up and Spike-piledrive him, oh no. Junior, I know this is your Dad, but surely you must be concerned?

DJJ: I watched him go to war with the **Ultimate Ninja, Rick Challenger, Frank Leatherman Snow, Beautiful Bobby Blanchard** and even Mike Moore so I have seen him pretty banged up, but he always found a way to fight back. You think he is down for the count and then suddenly he comes back.

JB: Even now he is pulling himself up with the ring ropes and the buzzer sounds and here comes Eddie Sweat! He has always let his wrestling do the talking and right now he is giving Arson Inc. a piece of his mind with a series of chops and punches. Cross stops stomping at DJ and gets a few chops from Sweat as well. Sweat is taking the fight to both men, but a vicious eye rake puts an end to that. Eddie is trying to shake off the blurry vision and regains his vision just in time to see Cross and Pyro fly off the ropes with double clotheslines. Pyro covers, 1... 2... kick out! Why would thy try to eliminate Sweat but not Jackson?

There is the buzzer and Arson Inc. is together as Michael Thorn joins the action and the teamwork from these three is evident and strong. They are working over Sweat with a series of double and triple team moves. DJ gets to his feet and asks the ref about the DQ rule. Ref Willy Pinnem says there isn't any DQ in this match and as Arson Inc. closes in DJ drops to one knee and fires off what can only be described as very DQ-worthy sack taps that stun all three members. The fans roar their approval and Sweat follows that move up with a chorus line of knee lifts! Just like that this match may be evened up and there is the buzzer. James Blanchard comes in to the delight of the young girls in the audience who shriek in delight. James goes right to the top rope, leaps high in the air and crashes into all three members of Arson Inc. with a flying body press. He tries to pin all three, 1... kick out by all three and now we have a three-on-three brawl on our hands. James and Johnny are in one corner, DJ and Michael another and Eddie is with Cross, a triple Irish ship sends all three members of Arson Inc. crashing into each other, Pyro spills to the floor, DJ and Cross resume exchanging punches and Sweat wraps Thorn in a small package! 1... 2... kick out!

There is the buzzer and Bonecrusher runs down and begins clobbering James from behind. Sweat comes over to help, but Bonecrusher slams Sweat into the ringpost. Oh no Sweat may have been lacerated he is still down and the silent assassin is busted open. DJ slams Cross into the Spanish announcer's table, and seems to be looking for something, but before he can find it Bonecrusher barrels into him and sends DJ into Caribbean legend, Juanny B! My Gawd!

Bonecrusher turns to find James, but James finds him first and bulldogs Bonecrusher into the table! James springs up and screams into the air as the fans respond with an ovation. There is the buzzer and Brad Blanchard jogs down to the ring, runs up the steps and springs off the apron to crash into Thorn. There are bodies all over this place and everyone is up and brawling, even Eddie Sweat who is even bloodier now and staggering across the ring. Pyro hits the Burn Notice on Sweat and goes for the 1... 2... NO! Broken up by DJ who just made it in time to break it up. DJ and Pyro fall out of the ring fighting, but Bonecrusher his powerslams Sweat, covers, 1... 2... 3! Sweat is out. Thorn is double dropkicked by Brad and James they make the cover on him, 1... 2... 3! Thorn is eliminated. I can't believe it. Bonecrusher swings at James, but he ducks and Brad dropkicks Bonecrusher to the mat, James leaps off the top rope with the Alabama Jam! Covers, 1... 2... 3! The buzzer sounds and we finally get to see who the mystery fifth member of their team is... No one is coming. This is bizarre. DJ DDT's Cross and Brad lands the Alabama Jam! Pyro throws DJ to the floor and kicks Brad in the stomach. James bulldogs Cross to the mat and then scrambles to cover. 1... 2... 3! Cross is gone. Only Pyro remains holding a steel chair and there is the buzzer and Mike Moore is waling to ringside and he has a steel chair! Oh this is a man who really goes all out when he is ready to inflict pain on his enemies. Pyro is in the corner ready to fight them all off with that steel chair, as Moore reaches the ring and points to Pyro and what the hell! The lights have gone off! I can hear the sounds of a steel chair slamming into flesh. They are sickening thuds. Now a light if flickering on the ring and from the overhead shots we can see it is in the shape of a red cross that fills the ring.

The lights are back on and oh my gawd! The Blanchard Boys are out cold on the mat, DJ is standing in the middle of the ring Pyro's steel chair is bent in a sickening fashion and raises it again. Mike Moore raises his chair to match him, they charge across the ring and both slam the chairs into DJ's head! NO NO NO! OH maw gawd! DJ is rolling on the mat holding his head. Mike invites Pyro to make the cover and he covers James for the 1... 2... 3! Now Pyro covers Brad, 1... 2... 3! This is crazy. What has come over Mike White Lightning Mopre? Why has he done this? DJ struggles to one knee and is trying to pull himself up, but oh no he face is a crimson mask! The fans are stunned and I can't believe it myself. Moore slaps DJ then lifts him and hits the Lightning Power-plex! Moore covers, 1... 2... 3! Pyro and Moore hi-five each other! This was a set up. What the hell is going on? Mike what are you doing? What happened? (Moore and Pyro step out of the ring and approach the announcer's table. Moore stops in front of Dick Jackson Jr. and picks up a microphone.)

MM: What am I doing? I'll tell you what I'm doing, Jim. I'm putting an end to the way the BRL caters to the like of Dick Jackson and the Blanchards. I'm one of the most decorated wrestlers in BRL history, but the sons of a star or their precious Maddog returns and they get whatever they want. You can boo all you want, but the days of favoritism are over! The offer from the Red Cross was the last straw. What happened here tonight is just the beginning.

JB: The Red Cross has struck again and this time he has added one of the most powerful stars in BRL history. Who is behind this madness?

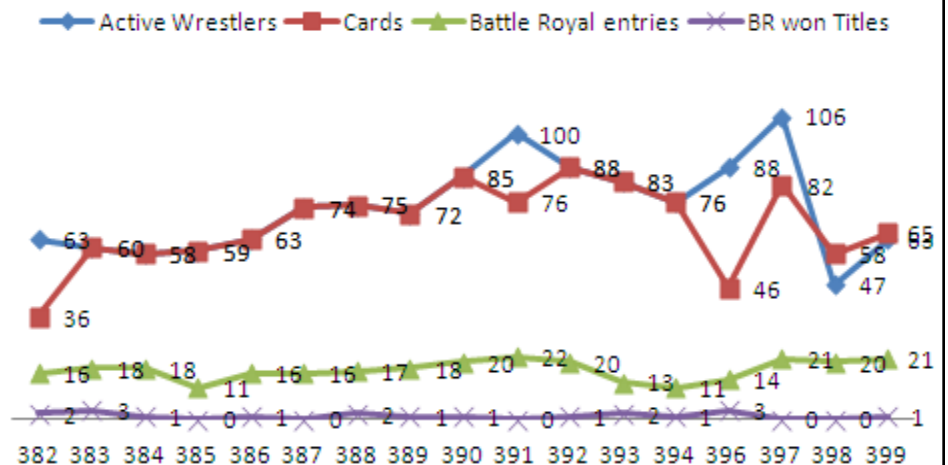

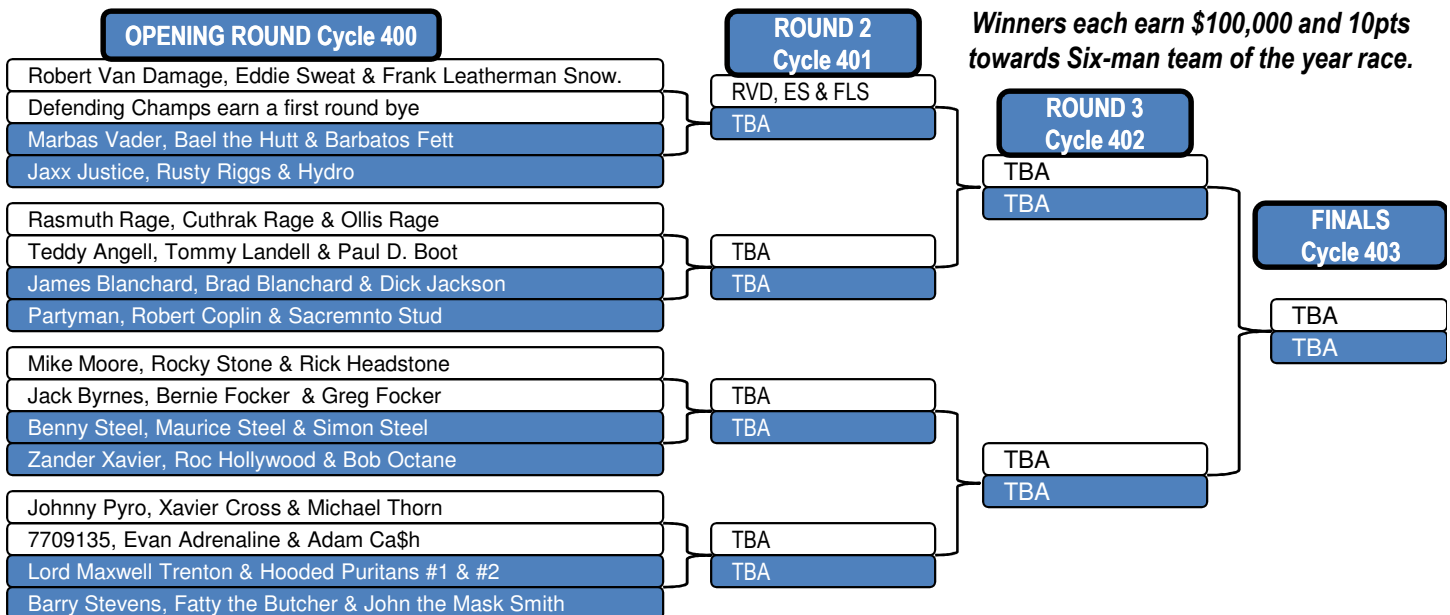

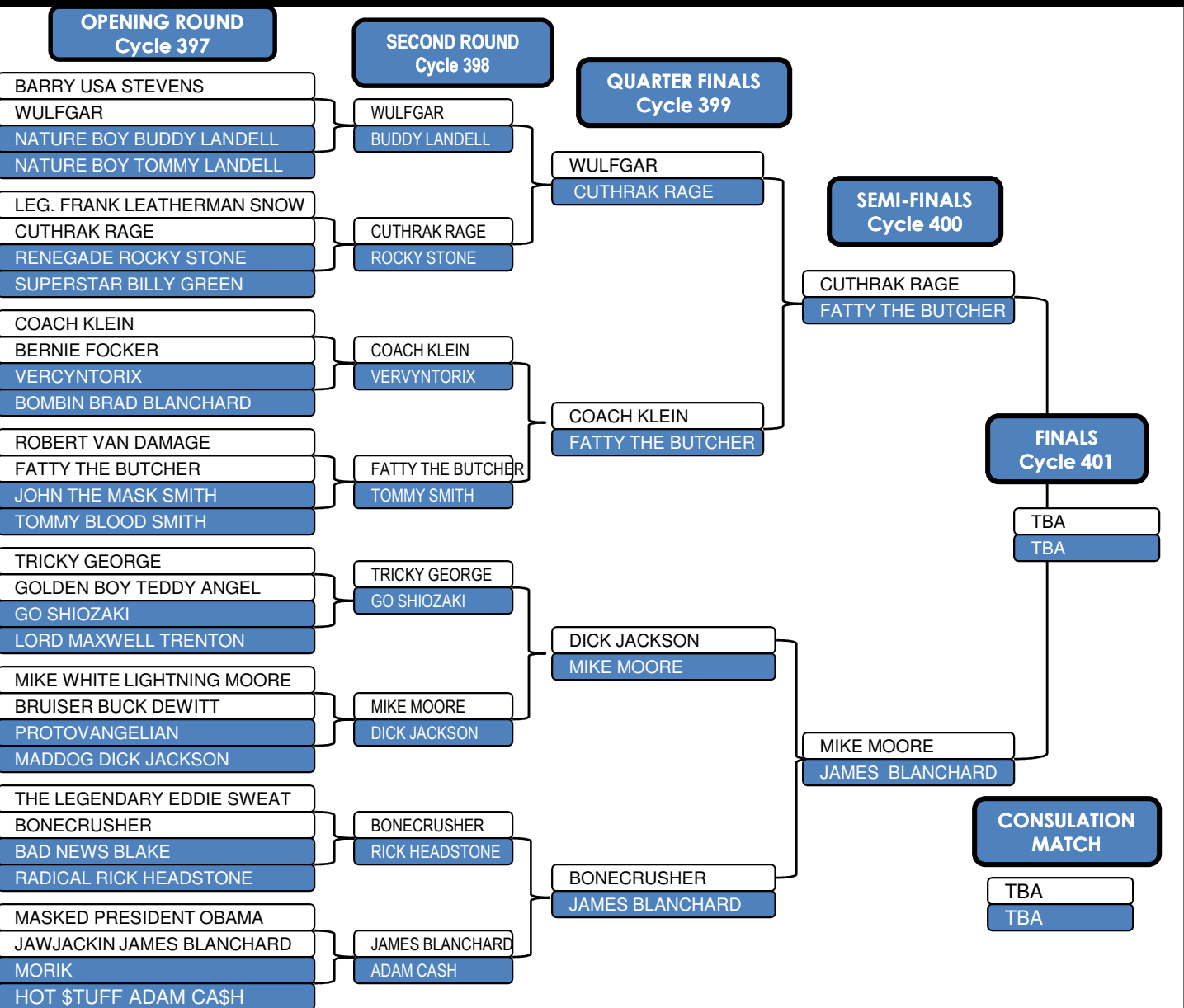

THE 2011 TRIPLE D CUP TOURNEY STARTS NOW!



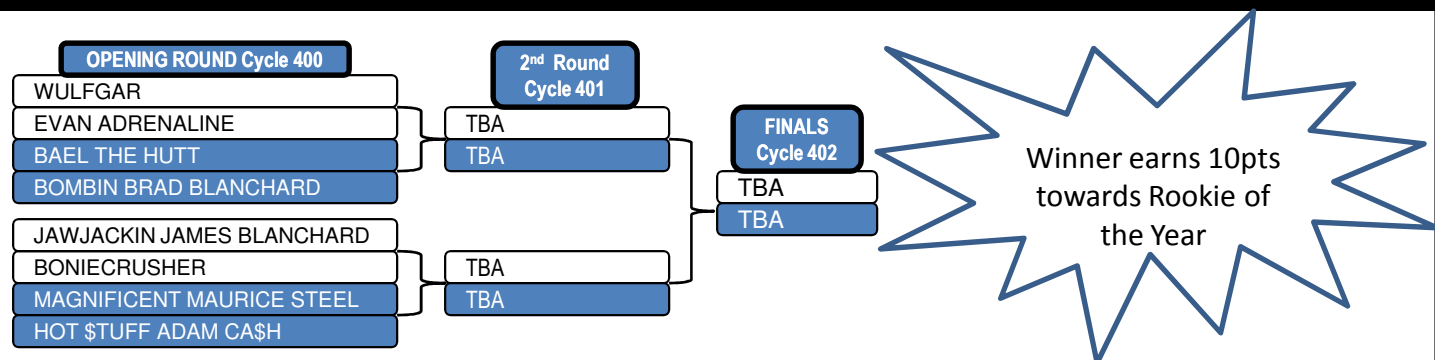

THE BRL'S 400TH CYCLE CELEBRATION – YEAR BY YEAR RECAP 1985-1997

1985-1988: The earliest days of the BRL were dominated by popular stars like Dr. Death, Wahoo Lightfoot, GI Joe Kartman, Boss Magnum CC and Abdullah the Ugandan Warrior battled the Venom Squad, Bucky Maxwell, Hot Shot Steve Foster and Nick Lear. Vicious Dog defeated Heartburn Hector to become the first Television champion (cycle#22) and the biggest angle involved Wahoo Lightfoot turning on Dr. Death during a tag match to join (first Commissioner) Lavishing Leroy Pearson's stable the International Time Killers.

1989: The South Philly Posse's Brian the Slasher Propp held the League title for a record setting four cycles in a row only to mysteriously leave soon after. A flood of new talent included; Hades and his team Cerberus, while of Superstar Rick Riley, Playboy Paul Riley, Magnificent Marc McCauley, Greg Madden & General War become the Doom Patrol to battle Bad News Brad Silberburg's Murder Foundation which was a army of Horror movie killers in a bitter feud. Mr. X takes flops as Commissioner, Matt Riley takes over.

1990: Dr Death returns with a suspiciously inflated record many doubt. The 1989 Rookie of the Year, Rick the Gangster Danger loses a Loser Leaves League cage match to Rick Riley, but uses a loophole to remain. Multi-time IWA Champion, Sheik Yerbutti joins The Doom Patrol in trouncing the hated Murder Foundation right out of the league. Infamously teams like The Sax brothers and Warriors (Blaster, Iron & Death) that dominated all over the IWA, arrive and fail to succeed in the increasingly tough BRL. Hades begins a career run of excellence in the BRL that will see him become one of the greatest of all time with a combined 17 League and TV title reigns.

1991: Mr. DDT & The Mohawk Kid d. The New York Yankees to win the first Tag Team tournament that would later be named after Frank Marano. The South Philly Posse (Propp, Magnum, & The Warrior) return and feud with Spike & Brian Vicious in feud that featured many street fights. Dr. Death stuns the fans by attacking Rick Riley's mother and the violent bloody feud finally ends when Riley defeat's the league's first legend in a Loser Leaves League cage match. In one of the first scandals to rock the IWA, The Sensation Foundation's Isao Mariyoko's 3 cycle reign is erased and the managers are banned from the IWA and it leads to the establishment of the multi-division set up.

1992: The IWA's biggest names begin to arrive and suddenly the BRL is like the IWA's real-life All-Star league, Flamethrower, Masked Terror, Hotshot Sean Diamond, Diamond Brett Robbins, Steve Speed, Sgt. Gladiator, Gargantua, Woodstock Warren Peace, GQ John Rodeo, Professor AI B Nice, Jumping Joey Magnolia, Diamondback Rick Silver, Ultimate Ninja, The Spoiler, Frank Leatherman Snow, Jim Thunder, Kostar the Barbarian, Cougar Buchanan, Mel Macho Man McCauley, Howie Jammer and Badd Co: Rick Challenger, Tommy Idol & Johnny Dream. Badd Co. attacks Speed, but Dick the Dog Jackson storms the ring and resumes his SPL feud with Challenger. Rick Riley retires due to numerous injuries from his prior matches with Dr. Death and Hot Rod Hoven. Frank Marano passes away due to Hodgkin's disease and while the IWA loses a pioneer who managed greats like Sheik Yerbutti, Phantom Striker, Syrian Assassin and the Danger Family, I lose a good friend. The mysterious Shroud brainwashes Frank Snow into turning on his pupil, Dick Jackson and his valet Mariah which lead to the Imagibash 92's main event with Jackson and Silver d. Snow & Challenger in a cage match. In a battle of Kings of the Ring, the BRL's Kostar the Barbarian beats the HNL's Snazzy Ricky Sexton. Badd Co. turns on Idol after he cost them the finals of the Marano Tag tourney to Marvel Man & Nova. The brutal 'ring of fire' match series between Flamethrower and Gargantua is held up when Flamethrower is suspended for burning a young fan at ringside with a fireball. After Dream turned on Challenger, Jackson offered him a chance at redemption, setting up Battlecade's main event of with former enemies Jackson and Challenger facing Snow and The Spoiler in a cage match. Despite Mariah missing before the match, DJ & RC vow to win, but are shocked by the double revelations that The Spoiler is actually Tommy Challenger and The Shroud is in fact, Mariah! Snow wins the Wrestler of the Year award with Mariah at his side and a heartbroken Jackson is left a bloody mess. The Terminator and Up

1993: Another wave of talent arrives including Fabulous Brian Flamingo, Goliath, Bodacious Brad Blaze, Hollywood Hamilton, The Terminator, Purple Hays, The Barbarian and Mike White Lightning Moore. Spike & Brian Vicious d. Stan Strong & Buck Naked to win the Marano Tag tourney. The main event at Imagibash pits Snow vs Jackson in an feud ending finale, only to see Challenger reform Badd Co. with Rick Riley so they can turn on Jackson, who is saved by his Snow.. The Terminator & Purple Hays become the first BRL tag team to win the World Tag Team titles. Many of last year's top names depart the BRL claiming the league is too crowded. BRL legends, Wahoo Lightfoot & Hot Shot Steve Foster return to feud with Badd Co. Hades challenges Dick Jackson to a series, so the past and present of the BRL will determine the future. The 100th cycle is honored in every IWA bulletin and in that cycle, Hades and Jackson wrestler to a draw. The friendly rivalry between Purple Hays and Jim Thunder turns sour as they trade the TV title several times.

1994- Names arriving this year include; Heavy Metal Mike Pepple, Desperado, C the Body B, The Predator, The Running Man, Dynamite Dan Steele, Craig Cole & Jimmy Lee, Beautiful Bobby Blanchard & Heartbreaker Johnny Blanchard. The Mohawk Kid returned and formed a team with Mike Moore. The IWA replaces Commissioner Riley with Josh MacMillan and the league dips to its lowest activity in years. Within months Riley resumes the Commissioner spot. Percy Pink d. Jumping Joey Magolia in a best of five loser leaves league series. The most popular wrestler, Dick Jackson spoke out about the frustration of so many of his allies leaving. The Terminator & Purple Hays d. Cerberus 1 & 2 to win the Marano Tag Tourney. The Survivor Series match up pitted Hades, Ultimate Ninja Desperado, Megadeth & Cutthroat Mulligan d. Jackson, Snow, Moore, Pepple and the Mohawk Kid when DJ and Snow attacked Pepple outside the ring and then inside the ring, as Moore held Hades, the Mohawk Kid clotheslined Moore! As Hades pinned Moore, Mohawk Kid unmasked as Rick Riley set off a long violent feud. The Southern Boys, Cole & Lee become the 2nd BRL tag team to win the World Tag titles. Joey Magnolia returned to the joy of the fans. The Battlecade matches pitted stars of the BRL and HAL against each other. While donating toys to an orphanage, Moore was beaten with a Xmas tree by Rick Riley. As a whole, though, the year belonged to The Terminator who took 4 league, 3 tag, 8 six-man and 4 regional titles and set the record for most points as Wrestler of the Year at 140.

1995- Arrivals include; Tank Patton, US Steel, LA Hamilton, Wyatt Earp, Yankee Redneck, Gorilla Warfare, Flicker Nash, the Cereal Killers: Toucan Sam, Trix Rabbit & Count Chocula, Arson Inc; B D Flame & Flamethrower. The Blanchard's d. Anton & Wilfred Von Snapp to win the Marano Tag tourney. Vince Neil & Tommy Lee d. the Blanchard's to win the first ever Tag Team Derby. US Steel won four Battle Royals and the IWA's King of the Ring on his way to being rookie of the year. Badd Co. reunited to cross the line in their feud with the Southern Boys Cole & Lee with repeated attacks on Southern heritage including pouring yellow paint on the Confederate flag and brutally attacking Lee with a bucket of peaches. Dick Jackson leaves to tour the IWA. Survivor Series VI sees Joey Magnolia survive after pinning every opponent, but fans are stunned when long time good guy, Mike Moore turns on Joey. Jim Thunder suffers a mental break down, changes his name to Miguel and is eventually institutionalized. Hades wins the Iron Man Cup by beating Frank Snow in the finals. After the loss, Snow announces that he will retire. Playboy Paul Riley, in his final cycle, wins the tag titles for a 4th time, but never wins the league title.

1996- The Hired Assassin League's demine brought in stars like Thunderbolt McQ and Crusher McQ, Scotty Champion, Wolverine, Punisherr, Conman Jeff Conner and the popularity of the Tag team Derby draws in over 20 new teams to compete. The Blanchard's d. Badd Co. Challenger & Riley to win the Marano Tag tourney while _____ won the Tag team derby. Two years of controversial promos finally boiled over when Badd Co. attacked IWA President Johnny B which forced Rick Challenger into retirement and a 10year suspension for Rick Riley. The Predator's amazing streak in steel cage match wins uncanny. The competitiveness of the BRL earned top spot in the IWA's Top Ten Toughest league's list three cycles in a row. Scotty Champion d. Vince Neil to win the King of the Ring and then d. Johnny Blanchard to win the Intercontinental title, thus unifying the belts. The return of Dick the Viper Jackson was welcomed by the fans and a year long feud with Bobby Blanchard ensued.

1997- A influx of talent including The Badd brothers, Smiling Sonny Pritchard, Sinister Colt Flaxton, The Crippler Conner Slade, The Alberta Clipper, Handsome Harley Leather, Blazin Billy Starr, Playboy Scotty Rich and The Specialist Chris Stevens brought the levels of Trash Talk to new highs. Badd Co Rick Riley appealed his suspension in order to feud with the Badd brothers and was so focused on winning he destroyed the Triple Crown title he held! Mike Moore called in Bloodaxe to aid him in his feud with the Badd brothers who seemed to make enemies with everyone. Cereal Killers d. Scotty Rich & Bowe Henderson to win the Marano Tag tourney ending the chance for a Blanchard brothers threepeat. The once very popular Reckless Rueben Esbanio jealousy over the popularity of stars like Chris Stevens and Billy Magnolia lead to a darker style that fans didn't accept. Johnny Dream returned to the BRL with Ricky Rage as the Midnight Marauders while a new version of Badd Co. composed of Rick Hamilton & Johnny Angel. In the most shocking event of the year, Summer Slaughter 97 featured a three-way dance between the Marauders-Blanchards-Love Connection finish saw the Grappler from the CEL storm the cage deliver a stunner on Johnny and then Bobby soared from the top rope to Alabama Jam his own brother! The grappler unmasked to reveal The Stunner Steve Anderson (Hammerson) Bobby's original tag team partner and the rings of the BRL turned red with the blood of the Blanchard brothers.. Chris Stevens continued to fend off many challenges, but it was the Angel of Darkness who barely edged him out for the Wrestler of the Year award.

THE BRL'S 400TH CYCLE CELEBRATION – YEAR BY YEAR RECAP 1998 - 2011

1998-2004: I was out of the IWA at this time, so I can not comment on these years... Sorry...

2005: An influx of big names includes 1991 Wrestler of the Year Superstar Scott Summers, Samoan Rockers (Manu & Saru), Kevin the Cause Starr, Former World Champion Brian Pelfrey, Mel Macho Man McCauley, The Hawaiian, C the Body B, Dynamite Dan Steele, Super Killer Devasto, Quebec Hitman M. R. Plante, Leather Rebel Spike Frenzy, Awesome Sean MCA, Dimitrios the Traveler, the Outlaws: Frank Blood, Bart Logan and former World Champion Clint Lomax and during this time Stone Barrington was at the peak of his powers. Frank Leatherman Snow battled MCA as Sly Smith pondered another series... The tag team scene was really exciting which made the 3-cycle reign by Outlaws Lomax and Logan so impressive... It wasn't long before a feud between former Badd Co. members erupted when the Midnight Marauders (Johnny Dream and Ricky Rage) and Rick Riley & Victor Von Snapp (returning for the first time since 1997) went back and forth, but it was Riley & Vpn Snapp who became fourth BRL team to win the IWA World Tag Team titles... Ravishing Rick Hamilton and Stone Barrington engaged in a feud over who was truly in charge of the BRL. Barrington's words eventually spun into a true grudge match between Barrington and Riley. Early on, this series was all Stone, as the rising star held court on the veteran, but over time the momentum swung in Riley's favor... The Japanese big man, Mega Money Machine was a huge hit with the fans as he battled an assortment of bad guys... The Suicide Serpents, Confederate Kobra, Executioner 2 and another former IWA World Champion, Blitzkrieg Viper arrived and use their promos to extol their superiority to the league and soon would find worthy opponents from an unlikely source...

2006: The bloody feud between the popular rookie, Barry U-S-A Stevens and the hated masked menace, Super Nuclear Assassin 1 earned feud of the year while it lasted... Yankee Black Mamba and Rasheezzy also engaged in a bitter rivalry with Executioner 2 and Confederate Kobra that saw them exchange several titles... The Quebec Hitman M. R. Plante took shots at Stevens, Mega Money Machine and the fans during his angry tirades... Stables began to over run the league including, ACE, WCW, LB, UZI, UKA and even the Baddest American Bikers joined in the power struggle to take control. Disgusted by the direction of the BRL, Badd. Co. Rick Riley and Victor Von Snapp opted out of their contracts to wrestle overseas... The year saw many durable League champions as The Legendary Eddie Sweat, Easy E. Joe Cool, Yankee Black Mamba, Rasheezzy all managed to win and retain the BRL title... The unlikely trio of Rick Hamilton, Spike Frenzy and Eddie Sweat set the BRL record for longest six-man reign with an impressive four cycle run as champs... Speaking of trios, the Rage brothers, Cuthrak, Ollis and Rasmuth entered their second league in the BRL and really began to show the skills that would make them one of the most dominating teams since Cerberus... The popular Samoan Rockers earned Tag Team of the Year honors with two Tag titles runs and by winning the Marano Memorial Tag Team Tournament... Sadly by the end of the year, the league lost a number of its most talents stars and the ratings dropped as a result...

2007-2009: Sadly I was away and details are sketchy. We can say that during these years the constants were Frank Snow's Leather Brigade, John the Mask Smith and the Baddest American Bikers. Over the years, the Bikers got a lot of flak for their Trash Talk, which was 90% the same except for the minor changes to call out a different foe, but to their credit, they helped keep the BRL alive when many others didn't care to. John the Mask Smith on the other hand has been a silent warrior (for the most part) who has always taken part in the Battle Royal and always been active. He hasn't been the most successful wrestler, but he is another big part of what has made the BRL great. The Leather Brigade has changed it's roster, but stars like Eddie Sweat, Rick Hamilton, Dark Phoenix FS, Robert Van Damage, Tommy Landell and Teddy Angel all helped keep the levels of greatness alive. Scott Hall, Kevin Nash and The Man Known as Syxxx arrived and quickly impacted the title page and would soon go on to bigger things... Protovangelian and Vercyntorix took the Tag Team of the Year honor with their ability to raise their level of skill to their competition...

2010: The BRL opened up quietly not knowing that this year would end very differently with the return of Rick Riley and Victor Von Snapp in April. Soon after IWA Legend Mike White Lightning Moore returned with Rocky Stone and Rick Headstone and quickly resumed the rivalry with Sly Smith's team of Bruiser Buck DeWitt, Superstar Billy Green and Bad News Blake... The mysterious duo of the Silver Pharoah and Cario Embalmer became the fifth BRL tag team to win the IWA World Tag Team titles... Another string of tough champions was on as Black Thunder Tom Flash, Caden Roberts, Mike Monopoly, Atomic Rocker Axl X and Bruiser Buck DeWitt all won and retained the BRL championship only to see one-time champion Cuthrak Rage and his 9 regional titles took home the Wrestler of the Year honor... The son of Maddog Dick Jackson, Dick Jackson Jr. joined Jim Bossy as the color-commentator for the BRL's broadcasts and his wise-crack rubbed many the wrong way. The Crazy Wolf Jake Ryan got so angry he attacked DJ Jr. and bloodied him with the Wolf Claw. Victor Von Snapp came to Jackson's aid and set off a bloody series of matches that lead to injuries to both men. Von Snapp's knees both required surgery and Ryan's claw-hand needed to be reset... Fatty the Butcher, a fork-wielding wildman of considerable girth arrived and began to attack John the Mask Smith while leaving a 'red cross' symbol after each attack. Perhaps the most shocking moment, John the Mask Smith was when Smith broke his silence and cut a promo vowing not to let Fatty's attacks end his career... One of the IWA's veterans, Rock n Roll Erich Von Wolf arrives for a short, but successful stint... The feud between the Leather Brigade, led by Tommy Landell would take on the Baddest American Bikers to a final showdown and by the end, the Bikers would be gone from the BRL for the first time in nearly a decade... The Commissioner's Office sanctioned a new title, the Asylum title which sparked a wild series of matches as champion Robert Van Damage fended off Fatty the Butcher in a true contrast of styles with high flying vs brawling... The feel good story of Patrick McManus, a bouncer turned pro wrestler ended quickly when he was injured at the hands of newcomers the Gruesome Brothers, Ozzy, Vic and Eddie who left the league after a contract dispute... Rick Riley challenges Mike Moore to be his opponent for his 'retirement' match, but as many fans now know, this was just a ruse and Riley and Von Snapp would leave the BRL to tour the IWA... The successful Roberts brothers stunned many fans when they turned on them and claimed they were not being appreciated as the never-say-die competitors they were right up until they left the BRL... A series of promos by rookie Hot Stuff Adam Ca\$h displays his wealth and his mission to give the fans the type of wrestling they deserve... The BRL was made apart of the American Division and Mike White Lightning Moore took the American title in his first shot, but would soon be followed by Blaze Diablo and The Man Known as Syxxx... A tournament to determine the new Global champion is won by The Man Known as Syxxx and soon whispers of a unification match between the two titles... The Arrogant Empire attempts to smothering the league with flooders, but that is about to change forever... The veteran team of Robert Van Damage, Eddie Sweat and the Dark Phoenix FS defeated the wild Gruesome brothers in the finals of the first Triple D Cup Six-man tournament... The Rage brothers did something remarkable when they tied the record for longest six-man reign set by Rick Hamilton, Eddie Sweat and Spike Frenzy...

2011: The combination of Commissioners leads to an aggressive recruiting drive that leads to some big names coming in. Lord Maxwell Trenton, the Hooded Puritans, Satanic Stormtroopers, Movie Stars in the Making: Roc Hollywood & Zander Xavier, Coach Klein, Bobby Boucher, Sacramento Stud, Partyman, Robert Coplin, Bonecrusher, Arson Inc: Francis Xavier Cross, Johnny Pyro and Michael Thorn, Bob Octane, Sugar Daddy Pimp, The Steel Brothers: Maurice, Benny and Simon, Evan Adrenaline, 7709135, Bael the Hutt, Barbotas Fett and more on the way... The 2006 Most Popular BRL Wrestler, Barry U-S-A Stevens returns and is soon attacked by the ferocious Wulfgar who despite his rookie status wrestles with skill beyond his years. Wulfgar swept a best-of-5 series with Stevens and vowed to win Wrestler of the Year... In another sign of the passage of time, James and Brad Blanchard the sons of BRL legend and IWA Hall of Famer, Beautiful Bobby Blanchard debut and take the league by storm. First James took the League title, then Brad did it but the stand out moment must be the finals of the 20th Marano Memorial Tag Team tournament as they faced odd pairing of Adam Ca\$h and Fatty the Butcher. The first match ended in a double count out, the second a grueling time limit draw and then finally the Blanchards won on a disqualification when Ca\$h was caught with Fatty's sharpened fork by the ref as he was trying to keep the match a fair fight... Mike Moore challenged Sly Smith's trio to a rematch of last year's much followed best-of-five series, but after taking a 2-0 lead, nearly the entire AE stable, 40 members pulls out of the BRL when a 6 wrestling limit is announced... The first King of the Ring Million Dollar Tournament is announced and a side effect of the AE pull out was a reseeding of some of the competitors, which lead to some great matchups and one great rematch that featured Moore taking on one of the popular IWA stars ever, Maddog Dick Jackson. Moore won both matches, but not without some protest over favoritism being shown to the darling of the BRL... The attacks set up by the The Red Cross, known only for the calling cards left at the scene results in a series of attacks on the Blanchard brothers that leave them laying in the ring. Bonecrusher, an old enemy of their father announces he has been paid by the Red Cross to destroy the Blanchards and to show that no one is safe, he attacks DJ Jr. so brutally he is hospitalized for months... Arson Inc. returns to the BRL, as Johnny Pyro and Francis Xavier Cross stun fans by turning on the Blanchards and announcing they too are on a mission from the Red Cross to destroy the legend's kin...

THE BRL'S 400TH CYCLE CELEBRATION – FAVORITE BRL MEMORIES FROM MANAGERS PAST & PRESENT

"I do not have any one favorite memory... here are a list of happenings that I do. BCL merges with the BRL, the Frank Marano Tournament, the Rail Road Warriors, and one of the McCauley wrestler's dies in a car wreck." – Brian Pelfrey

"Even though I left the IWA eight years ago, I still have some fond memories of the game. And when I do think back on the fun I had, the first thing that pops in my head is the old BRL. I joined the league for two reasons: it was the oldest continually active league in the game and it was strictly a character based league. When I got there, I immediately started having fun with my characters. From feuding with other players to a long, drawn-out feud with my fellow WWW manager, Mike Moore's wrestlers, there was never a dull cycle. At one point, we were without a commissioner so I applied, not really thinking I would get it. To my surprise, I was awarded the post and immediately did all I could do to make the league fun. From the quarterly Fight Night cards to the annual Tag Team Derby, to the various other contests I held, everything I did was in hopes it made the great Battle Royal League more enjoyable for everyone." - Eric Tackett

"Winning the BRL's 100th bulletin Battle Royal with Tribulation." – Ken Lee

"Back in the day, the BRL was ruled by many forces, the most notable were the legend of legends, the House of Vendetta, New Age Management, Original Pain Foundation, the Leather Brigade and of course the Wild West Warriors. There wasn't a cycle that went by that these stables duked it out for the high spots in the BRL. Many of the members were hold outs from the Hired Assassin League and it was during this time that David Schinkus and Johnny Vendetta started the largest and most legendary feud of them all. David contacted a guy that looked a lot like Johnny and claimed that he was Johnny's younger brother Jimmy. It was on from there. Nothing stopped either of them from spilling blood. Johnny eventually won and it wasn't without a price. Johnny retired shortly after that and the House of Vendetta saw its last ride as part of the Rulebreaker's Roost. Those were the days..." - Anonymous

"The reason I joined the IWA was because I thought it'd be fun to create a wrestler - name, personality, moves - and go up against other managers who were just like me in that I was a wrestling fanatic. Every month I looked forward to the newsletter, see how I did, what everyone else was doing, etc. It was one of the original ways fans could connect to one another, decades before Facebook, and it was a blast." - Nancy (Sodano) Varela

What I remember about the BRL was that winning the league title meant more than any other typical league (besides the cash leagues) because the level of competition was generally higher. The negative thing was that the prestigious leagues also drew many wrestlers with fake records taking away title shots for legit contenders. – Nelson Ho

I enjoyed competeing in BRL cause of the great Tournments and Events as well as The BRL Commissioner's Championships having competed in several Marano Tournments was a great Fun Time and I look Forward to Returning to BRL this coming cycle #400 as the Time as come for the Return of The Hammerson's the Orginal "Ruthless Aggression Leaders" so good job BRL on making it to # 400 and I hope BRL makes it to another #400 cycle's Great Job BRL keep it up!!!! and I also wanna say Great Job to both Commissioner Riley & Commissioner Frank Snow on making the BRL the league it is today keep up the great work! – Johnny Stryker

*"Literally twenty years later I can somehow still remember who I had in the BRL even though I was running with a 200 plus man roster. Don't think I ever got a league title out of him but I think Hiroshi Fujiwara picked up a few regionals along the way.
